

# Pupil premium grant expenditure: Report to parents – 2013/14



## Overview of the school

## Nature of support in 2013/14

*The Deputy Head is non class based, as is one other full time teacher. This enables additional targeted groups to take place.*

*One teacher is non class based for part of the week and targets PPG children in Upper Key Stage 2. another teacher targets PPG children for additional maths in Y3/4*

*Targeted additional TA support available in each class daily . Class sizes are kept to a minimum*

*We have funded a Behaviour Mentor, Learning Mentor, Higher Level Teaching Assistant and Family Support Worker.*

*Teaching Assistants who are non-class based support PPG children with additional needs e.g EAL and Speech and Language. These staff are fully trained*

*Booster maths class for Y6*

*Subscription to Reading Eggs and Mathletics*

*Daily access to Reading Eggs and Mathletics for PPG children . After school groups for targeted PPG children*

*Investment in Ipads, and chrome books for KS2 pupil premium children (45 ipads, 24 Chrome books)*

*Nurture groups set up by Behaviour Mentor/Learning Mentor targeting PPG*

## Curriculum focus of PPG spending in 2013/14

*Raising standards in Reading, Writing and Maths*

*Further closing the gap between PPG/Non PPG*

*Leadership team focus on core subjects (Big Picture)*

*All staff are aware of PPG and their additional needs*

*PPG children highlighted on planning so TA's/ staff are fully aware of who needs additional targeting*

### **Measuring the impact of PPG spending**

*The school evaluates the impact on each pupil at the end of every term through the in depth analysis of APS progress*

*Evaluation focuses on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the interventions.*

*Analysis of the ongoing impact of the Family Support Worker through monitoring of Punctuality and Attendance, especially with reference to the PPG children.*

*Analysis of attendance and punctuality data shows that we now have only 23% of current PA children who are PPG compared to 55% in 2012-13*
