Could your child be entitled to a free school lunch?

Your child may be able to have free school meals if you claim any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit

If you think you may be eligible, please come and speak to Miss Linsley, Mrs Arthur or Mrs Taylor. The more children we have in school who claim Free School Meals, the more money the government gives us to be spent directly on them!

## News from Reception.....


